The first Thursday of the month (or the second as a rain date), the cruises are held at Nutmeg Bowling Alley, 802 Villa Avenue, in Fairfield, CT. Its lot is entered through the adjoining Stop and Shop parking lot. Nutmeg Bowl has an indoor bar and grill. The next Nutmeg

cruise will be on Thursday, August 1st at 5-8 pm.

As of September 5th, the Nutmeg cruises will move to the new Elicit Brewing Company at 111 Black Rock Turnpike in Fairfield, CT. Elicit will provide a special parking area for cruise night vehicles. In addition, they have an outdoor beer garden and several spacious indoor dining areas where you can order a variety of "Pub Food".

On the third Thursday of the month (or the fourth as a rain date), the car night cruises are held at Port Five, 69 Brewster Street in the historic Black Rock section of Bridgeport, CT. The next cruise at Port Five will be on Thursday, July 18th from 5-8 pm. While its lot is small and fills quickly, there is patio dining with expansive views of Long Island Sound where food and drink are available for all to enjoy. The last car cruise of the season will be on a Saturday, from 12-3 pm, October 5 at Port Five, with an Oktoberfest theme.
